### **Summary of Clinical Activity (last 5 years):**

As psychiatrist for the Positive Health Practice at Ward 86, I evaluate and treat patients with psychiatric illness and HIV. I provide consultation to internists, fellows, and nurse practitioners on managing psychiatric illness in their patients. Clinical work includes attention to the needs of special populations, including working with a multidisciplinary team in a drop-in clinic for HIV-positive women, and addressing issues emerging in HIV and Hepatitis C co-infection. As psychiatrist, clinical director, and co-investigator of the Health Outcomes of Mood Enhancement (HOME) Study, I evaluate potential participants for the study and treat participants in the intervention group, who receive directly observed antidepressant therapy according to protocols which I co-authored. I also supervise the work of the other clinical staff of the study. As psychiatrist for the Transgender Life Care program (which began as a UCSF grant-funded program, and has continued as a city-funded program), I evaluate and treat transgender patients, working with a multidisciplinary team at Castro Mission Health Center. In my faculty practice, I treat transgender, gender dysphoric, and HIV-positive patients referred from providers across Northern California, and I provide consultation on challenging cases to psychologists and other psychotherapists working with transgender and gender dysphoric patients.

### **Teaching Narrative:**

I lecture and lead case discussions in the PGY-I Psychiatry resident class, particularly on clinical care with lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender patients, as well as on cultural competence and diversity issues generally. ### **Current Research Program:**
